

General Information on Minor Programs at OSU

1. Minor programs are not required for graduation, although some programs do include a minor.
2. A student may not take a major and a minor in the same subject.
3. Courses used on the minor may not be used on the major.
4. All minors require a minimum of 20 credit hours; some require more.
5. No more than 10 hours of transfer credit may be applied to any minor.
6. When students complete more than one minor, each minor must contain a minimum of 20 unique hours.
7. No grade below a C- will be permitted in courses comprising the minor; the minimum overall CPHR of the minor shall be a C or 2.00.
8. Courses taken on a Pass/Non-Pass basis may not be applied to the minor. Courses that do not use letter grades, but are graded S/U can be counted on the minor.

General Procedures for Completing the Minor in Theatre

1. Students interested in the minor should check with the Director of Undergraduate Studies in the Department of Theatre to find out about course offerings, frequency of offerings, and special enrollment conditions in theatre courses.
2. Students should remember that many theatre courses are 3 credits, so the minor could include as many as 8 courses.
3. Students may choose from any of the theatre offerings, including practicum courses and Theatre 100, to fulfill the minor. Students may choose to specialize in one aspect of theatre or to take an array of theatre courses. Students, though, must observe prerequisites.
4. Students may double count courses taken for the minor with requirements in the GEC.
5. One quarter before graduation, the student needs to submit the Minor Program Requirement Form to the Director of Undergraduate Studies in Theatre (or any other Theatre faculty) for approval. The Minor Program Requirement Form then needs to be filed by the student in his/her college advising office.
